"Please sign the petition to get Enfield Council to take more radical steps to clean up Edmonton for good and make it into a pleasant place to live, without dirty streets, dumped rubbish and flytipping."

- More cameras
- More penalties and prosecutions
- Naming and shaming
- Better information – languages
- Educate landlords and estate agents
- Images on wheeled bins
- Street sweeping, regular collections
- Street Hawks


