FAQs

Is it free?

Yes, this programme is completely funded by Local Trust, including all travel and subsistence expenses.

Do I need any specific qualifications to join the programme?

No qualifications are needed. As long as you are a Big Local worker, you can submit an expression of interest form.

Is it important to attend all the learning sessions?

Yes, you will be expected to give your full commitment to the entire programme to get the most out of it. If you don't think you will be able to make this commitment, please ask your LTO or Big Local partnership to support the time commitment required or recognise the timing may not be right for you at this time.

We welcome individual queries on this issue and may be able to provide further support (this will be assessed on a case-by-case basis).

What happens if I am unwell or need to rearrange a coaching session at the last minute?

Individual coaches will strive to provide maximum flexibility to accommodate your needs. Generally, if you miss a session without advance notice you will lose that session, but coaches will attempt to reschedule once before considering cancellation.

What technology or tools are required for participation?
